FULL STEAM AHEAD WITH 4/5/6

Welcome to Term 3 everyone. My, oh my how time has flown! It is great to be back at school and I am personally looking forward to this term, as much of the previous learning culminates in new thoughts, ideas and attitudes towards life and learning.

This week has been a hectic start and we enjoyed viewing the stage show, "Wind in the Willows" at the Mildura Arts Centre on Wednesday. The show was full of interesting language and was a dramatic interpretation of the novel, told from the perspective of the incorrigible, Mr Toad! It was fantastic for students to see the show prior to being familiarised with the text, as many preconceived ideas were absent, allowing for students to draw their own conclusions about initial character traits, before delving deeper into the nuances of the text. This is going to be a wonderful topic and students have already started to hold interesting discussions about unfamiliar vocabulary and themes within the novel.

On Friday, we looked the Positive Behaviours for Learning the code of conduct, and the expected behaviours for becoming successful students and

adults. The students lead very mature conversations and shared examples of how their behaviours could prevent them from respecting others, stop them from discovering things about themselves and their learning as well as how poor choices can stop us from meeting our aspirations. As this was so successful, students requested to look deeper at the issue of bullying. As bullying is part of the PD/H/PE curriculum, we explored bullying in general as well as cyber bullying and the devastating effects both can have on individuals. Students were highly engaged and after reflecting on a series of questions, answered by each individual student in their own language. I was so proud to read some of the responses that shared. I asked students pseudonyms if they had bullied other class members, so that they could be honest when reflecting on their own actions. Some of the wonderful responses are noted below:

Question: What would you change about your actions? Why?

Student Response: "Stop calling her names and say sorry and treat her the same as I would treat others because you realise how bad it is and what it feels like." – Year 4 student

Student Response: "Stop doing that to my little sister because I wouldn't do that to my friends and she doesn't deserve to be treated this way. I feel really bad about my actions towards her. I will try my best to be the best sister in the world." – Year 5 student

These are just 2 examples of the responses from students. All of the students identified that many of their bullying efforts came from jealousy and a desire for revenge and whilst identifying this, students said that they would stop doing the bullying because they could now see that it was wrong. This self-realisation is what we strive for in behaviour management and personal change and I am so proud of my students for being honest and wanting to change. One student even admitted that he'd bullied a teacher by running away from her and realised that it was wrong. Very powerful!

The consequences can include depression, anxiety, thoughts of self-harm and/or suicidal thoughts. Please remember that WE are

Other tips include making sure your child is not using social media sites that are unmonitored; students use ALL media devices under full parental supervision and that you KNOW without a doubt, who your children are connecting with.
